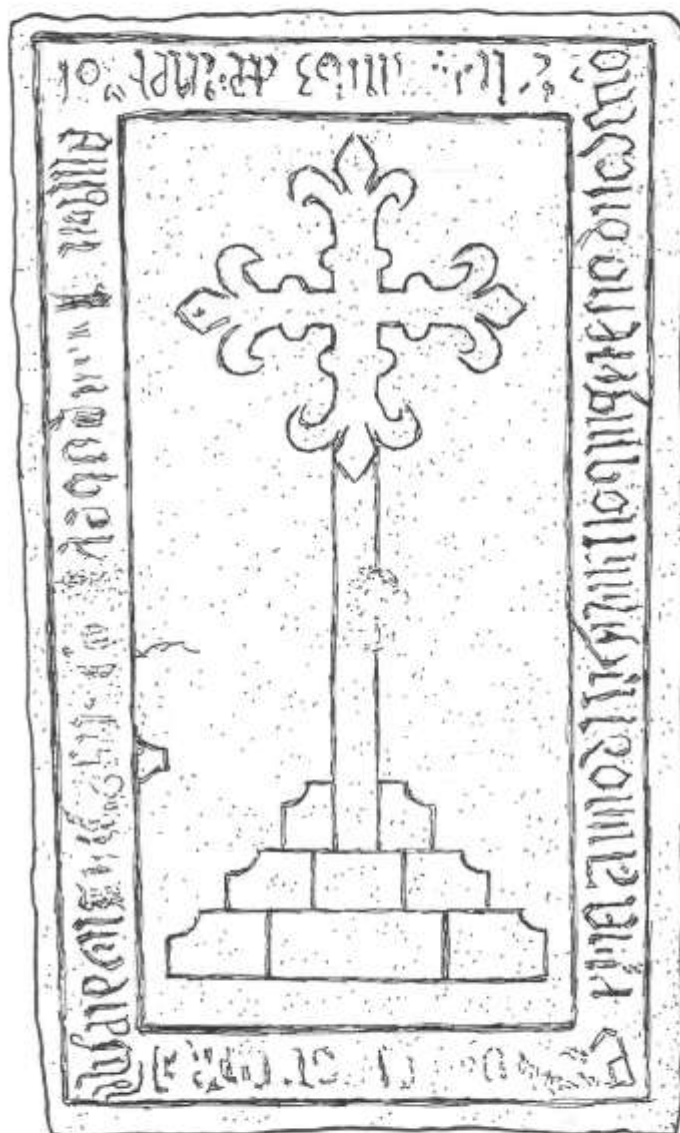


East Drayton, SS Peter and Paul

- (1) Rectangular floor stone at the south-east corner of the nave (may be under the lectern), incised design, in reasonable condition. Straight-arm cross with fleur-de-lys terminals, rising from a stepped 'masonry' base, marginal inscription between deeply-cut borders, in a crude and clumsy variant upon black letter, worn in parts and difficult to read. The date, spelt out on the south side, seems to be 1512. It is thought to commemorate a member of the local Burgh family.
