This new APP is far easier—than using the BDC or Nottinghamshire County Council web sites. If you do log any of these, please email Sue Purnell on cllr.suepurnell@gmail.com with a brief description of what you've raised and the reference number provided, so the tracker can be updated and we can see what we have as recurring problems and when they've been fixed.

1) Find the MyNotts App in the Appstore for your phone and download



2) When you open the App there will be a number of boxes to choose from.

To report a pothole select HIGHWAYS

5) Choose POTHOLES, ROADS AND PAVEMENT DAMAGE



6) You'll be asked to zoom in, just press **OK**



 Begin typing in the location of the Pothole and then tap on the correct name to choose



How to Report Potholes

8) Zoom in to get to street level (pinching two fingers to achieve)

Then tap the screen ONCE on the approx location to drop a pin (the lollipop in the green circle) NOTE: Make sure this is actually on a road or you will not be able to proceed further

Press CONFIRM



9) Under "What is the problem specifically relating to" choose **ROAD POTHOLE**

Under "Location of the problem"
Type in the What3words location
of the pothole
